



## Year 2

During the first half of the Autumn term we will be learning about the Great Fire of London. In Science we will look at what animals need to survive and be healthy. The ideas below are just suggestions. Feel free to be creative and add some of your own.

Listen to and learn by heart some traditional stories (such as The Three Little Pigs). Retell the stories in your own words either orally or written down and draw a picture to go with them.

Practise counting on and back in different steps, e.g. in 2s, 3s, 5s and 10s. Write two digit numbers and say what the tens column is worth and what the ones column is worth.

In Science we are learning about animals including humans and what they need to survive. Write a care kit for your pet or your favourite animal. What do they eat? How much exercise do they need? What are their babies like

Find out about a religion. Use the internet or library books. What are the key festivals in that religion? Do they eat particular foods? What do they believe in? Do they have a holy book? Create a fact file on the religion of your

Choose an object from nature and sketch it or make a model of it. As it is autumn this may be something you find on the path as you come to school (be careful with those spiky conker cases!)

Find out some facts about the Great Fire of London. You can make an amazing picture using yellow, orange and red paint or crayons.

We are looking at programming and word processing in computing. If you have access to a computer you could practise your skills at home. Begin by writing a few facts about yourself and have a try at changing the font and inserting a picture into what you have written.

Read regularly to yourself and to a grown up, or ask a grown up to read to you. Listen carefully and try to remember key facts and interesting bits from the story.
