
Monday 18th December

Please join us in the library on Friday afternoons after school 3:15-3:45 to choose a Weekend read!




CRASH Author Visits Autumn 2017




What a brilliant breakfast club we had with the very talented Sarah McIntyre - author and illustrator. Look at the amazing portraits she drew!
