

Year 2

During the second half of the Autumn term our theme will be 'What a Wonderful World'. In Science we will look at what 'Living things and their habitats. The ideas below are just suggestions. Feel free to be creative and add some of your own.

English — Read and look at information texts such as non-fiction books, news reports and leaflets.

Write down some of the facts and draw a picture to go with them.

In Maths practise addition and subtraction of 1-digit and 2-digit numbers. Recall and use multiplication and division facts for the 2, 5 and 10 multiplication tables Continue to practise counting in steps of 2, 3, and 5 from 0, and in tens from any number.



In Science we are learning about living things and their habitats. Go on a mini-beast hunt and see how many different mini-beasts you can find. You could draw them and write some words to describe them.

Choose and sort items into groups—living, dead or never alive.



RE— Find out about different types of good news. Retell and draw pictures to show each part of the Christmas story. Use the internet or library books to make a fact file about another religious celebration.

D&T—Sensational Salads. You could try to taste a new fruit and vegetable each week and record the ones you have tasted. Think of a different fruit or vegetable for each letter of the alphabet.



Geography— Find out some facts about the different continents and name the oceans. You make a fact file about a continent and maybe make a travel brochure.

Computing— Children will reproducing the painting styles of great artists using design based software. You could try recreating photos or pictures at home using pencils and pens, changing shapes and colours to create different effects.



Read regularly to yourself and to a grown up, or ask a grown up to read to you. Listen carefully and try to remember key facts and interesting bits from the story.
