



Year 4

During the first half of the Autumn term we are learning about the Anglo-Saxons and Scots in theme. For Science we are learning how the digestive system works. The ideas below are just suggestions. Feel free to be creative and add some of your own.

Write a story set in an imaginary world. Let your imagination run wild. Think Narnia, Middle Earth, Arendelle! Illustrate your story and write a blurb to entice people to read it.

Keep practising number bonds to 10, 20, 50, 100 and beyond. E.g. what goes with 17 to make 20? What goes with 55 to make 100?

In Science we are learning about the digestive system. You could make a model or a simple diagram of how food moves through the body. We are also looking at the different function of teeth. Carry out your own experiment. Which teeth do you use for which job (e.g. biting, tearing, chewing)? Can you name the different types of teeth?

Computing skills. Can you make a quiz and give it to your family to answer the questions? If you have access to a computer practise your word processing skills. Remind yourself and your family of the rules of internet safety.

Research the Anglo-Saxons and Scots using the internet or library books. Visit the World Museum to see the displays there. Make a poster or a leaflet showing what you have found out.

Use found objects to make an Anglo-Saxon weapon or other item used at that time (perhaps a helmet or a model of a house).

Share a book with family, this could be you reading to adults, adults reading to you or a mixture of the two. Write a short review or draw a picture from a favourite book.

Draw or make a sculpture of your favourite insect. Label the body parts. It could be one you find fascinating or even one you find a little creepy!
