



## Year 5

During the second half of the Spring term we are learning all about Eastern Europe. In Science we are researching forces and Earth and Space. The ideas below are just suggestions. Feel free to be creative and add some of your own. Some of the ideas are ongoing.

Read a book by an author that you haven't heard of yet. There are plenty in the school library! This could be you reading to adults, adults reading to you or a mixture of the two. Write a short review or draw a picture from a favourite book. This will be displayed in our class library.



Do a number of activities. Can you describe the forces used to help you carry out these activities?

Make a model boat... does it float? What forces are used to keep it afloat?

Find out about Easter traditions in other countries? Why do we celebrate Easter? Is the true meaning behind Easter reflected in modern society? Why do we have Easter eggs and Easter bunnies?

Be creative and do anything that furthers your knowledge on any of the subjects above. Research Earth and Space. Draw a poster to include what we can see in our Solar System? Can you think of a new Mnemonic to remember the order of the planets? Can you make a model of the solar system? Can you write a story about our solar system?

Our RE this half term looks at Easter and the Last Supper. Have you ever seen a picture of the Last Supper? Who was involved in the Last supper? Do Christians still follow what was done and said at the Last Supper?

In Science we are learning about Forces and Earth & Space. Can you let your imagination run wild and write a creative story that is out of this world? Think about the creative writing lessons we have already done on superheroes and Gods and Godesses. Posters, drawings, newspaper articles, cartoon strips. There's plenty you can do!

Keep practising the times tables you are unsure of. Remember to practise them in order and also out of order as well as the division facts that go with them. Try to learn any little tricks to help you (like the 9s on fingers – ask in school for a demonstration!) Now that you are in Year 5, your times tables are extra specially important! YOU NEED TO KNOW THEM ALL!!
