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| School swimming pool was upkept and controlled to a high standard to allow for outside agencies to use and for Year 6 to use at the end of the year | The Year 6 children were able to have a few last sessions in the pool before leaving. All children in KS2 swam every half term. The school was able to build strong relationships with other outside agencies and companies by letting them use the pool. | Pool upkeep - £6000 |
| Staff participated in online CPD on swimming, inclusive sport and ball games during the lockdown. | Teachers felt more confident teaching areas of the curriculum. | Staff training - £450 |
| PE apprentices were hired to assist with PE lessons and playtime activities in different year group bubbles. | Children were taught by PE specialists and the school was able to help train and inspire the apprentices. | Wages - £6,362 |

| New equipment, storage and kits purchased to enhance PE and swimming lessons. | New equipment purchased to improve the quality of PE taught in lessons and during free periods of the day. We invested in more sports storage to help keep the PE cupboard organised and easily accessible for teachers, we also invested money in new balls, nets and swimming goggles/hats to help the children with their swimming lessons. | £510 |

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| Children participate in a range of afterschool clubs including netball, football, tennis and multi sports – staff cover provided and overtime paid for selected staff members | Children were given the opportunities to join in with a range of competitive sport and learn a range of new skills. | £700 for staff overtime |
| Playground packs were provided for every classroom which consisted of footballs, basketballs, tennis balls, ping pong sets and skipping ropes per class | Every class was able to participate in different forms of exercise and sport during playtimes and daily exercise slots, encouraging children to try new things and be active. | £668 |
| LSSP Competitions Membership | Children were able to attend a range of inclusive competitions throughout the year building confidence and self-esteem. | £2,375 |
