#### Curriculum changes

We have used our two INSET days this week to train the staff in a new approach to curriculum. The first main change is the introduction of the 'CUSP' curriculum for the five key foundation subjects – History, Geography, Science, Art and DT. CUSP is a fantastic curriculum which enabled teachers to really think about the knowledge and

content that they are delivering to the children. CUSP is guided by evidence-led curriculum structures, such as retrieval, spaced retrieval practice and interleaving and this has led to exceptional outcomes for pupils. We look forward to refining this curriculum as we work through the year.

Attendance at Springwood Heath is currently below the national average and it is one of my priorities this year to improve this. Despite the curriculum changes we are making, if children are not attending school regularly they will not make the progress they are capable of. We should be aiming for 100% attendance wherever possible. Our new attendance policy will be shared later in the term but do please try to get your child in\_to school, on time, every day.

The second main change is to our English curriculum. The children will now be having two English lessons per day instead of one. There will be one 60-minute writing lesson – Ready Steady Write and one 40-minute reading lesson – Steps to Read. The children will be exploring some fantastic texts in these lessons and we are looking forward to seeing the rapid progress that they make this

### Pupil Premium Eligibility

Many of our children are entitled to a funding premium called 'Pupil Premium.' This provides additional funding to school to support with the delivery of interventions and the purchase of resources to ensure children reach their full potential. *We have particularly low numbers of registered pupil premium in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 as parents may assume due to free school meals, they are already registered as pupil premium.* 

All children who currently qualify for free school meals based on their family circumstances are entitled to pupil premium. This applies if you receive any of the following benefits:

- Universal credit (provided you have a net income of £7400 or less)
- Income support
- Income-based jobseekers' allowance
- Income-related employment and support allowance
- Support under Part IV of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of state pension credit
- Child tax credit, provided that you are not also entitled to working tax credit and have an annual gross income of £16,190 or less
